
Along with the Neweys retiring, our education manager, Brent du Toit, left the BRC team at the end of February, and so we have three new faces on our team that we're excited to introduce!

FIRST TERM CAMPS

We've had a fantastic first term of building into the lives of Grade 7 learners at our partner schools. Now in the third year of our education programme, Grade 7 camps mark the third and final camp that learners will be attending in our Grade 5-7 OEP cycle. This means that learners attending the camps are familiar and comfortable with the coaches and campus. Learners often arrive especially eager for the camp, filled with the expectancy of another excellent experience of fun activities, beautiful surroundings and delicious food!

Prefect Camp

The term kicked off with our Prefect Camp, where newly appointed prefects from five of our partner schools participated in a programme specifically focused on building leadership skills. Our schools often use the Grade 5 and 6 camps to highlight specific learners with leadership potential for their prefect selection, and getting to come on an extra camp at Bridges is an exciting reward for being elected as a prefect. Our coaches noticed that, on this camp, the prefects participated in the activities with a focused, goal-directed attitude. They were determined to make use of the opportunity for growth and developing new skills.

Grade Camps

The rest of the first term included eight more camps with Grade 7 learners from our partner schools. Our coaches noticed a transformation in the learners from when they last visited Bridges in Grade 6. Not only was there an improvement in behaviour, but learners showed an increased willingness to take responsibility for themselves and their teammates. They demonstrated a solution-oriented approach to the activities on camp, as well as a noticeable growth in character. We wish our Grade 7 learners all the best as they move on to high school, and trust that the life skills that they have developed at Bridges will set them on a positive trajectory for the next step in their journey.
