CAMP #1
9-11 JULY
ELNOR PRIMARY SCHOOL, ELSIES RIVER
GRADE 6
#LEARNERS: 51 | #EDUCATORS: 4

CAMP #2 16-18 JULY

CAMP #3 23-25 JULY JOOSTENBERG PRIMARY SCHOOL, STELLENBOSCH FARMING COMMUNITY GRADE 5 CAMP #LEARNERS: 54 | #EDUCATORS: 3

This Grade 5 camp was a delightful experience, with manageable numbers allowing for meaningful connections.

Educators were highly engaged and provided excellent feedback about the coaches and the hospitality team, who served delicious meals throughout the camp.

Many learners participated in an optional morning devotional, which proved to be impactful and enriching for them.





CAMP #4 30 JULY - 1 AUGUST ALPINE PRIMARY SCHOOL, MITCHELL'S PLAIN GRADE 6 CAMP #LEARNERS: 108 | #EDUCATORS: 7

This camp was larger than usual, which presented some challenges in behavior management. However, our coaches handled the situation with love and calmness, even in the face of some disrespect. It was inspiring to see natural leaders emerge among the Grade 5 learners, showcasing their potential.

The learners come from underprivileged backgrounds and with the cold weather, adequate clothing was an issue for some, just one of the challenges these children face. Despite these difficulties, the camp was filled with memorable moments, including a fashion show that turned out to be a highlight, with the boys truly stealing the spotlight! We were also blessed with good weather, a welcome change after the recent rain and cold.

CAMP #5 13-15 AUGUST ALPHA PRIMARY SCHOOL, FISANTEKRAAL, DURBANVILLE GRADE 5 CAMP #LEARNERS: 46 | #EDUCATORS: 3

The Grade 5 camp with Alpha Primary was a memorable experience. These first-time campers arrived feeling a bit quiet, but after orientation, they quickly began to relax and fill the air with joyful chatter.

Educators expressed how much they enjoyed the various activities, noting how well they aligned with the school curriculum and contributed to improving the students' self-awareness. They also provided wonderful feedback to the hospitality team, praising the nutritious meals that kept everyone energised throughout the camp.





CAMP #6 20-22 AUGUST CASCADE PRIMARY SCHOOL, MITCHELL'S PLAIN GRADE 5 CAMP #LEARNERS: 118 | #EDUCATORS: 4

The Grade 5 camp with Cascade Primary was another vibrant experience, with learners arriving full of energy! After a brief consequence for not listening (the water activity was temporarily removed), the campers quickly adjusted their behavior and engaged positively with the coaches and educators.

It was wonderful to see the educators actively involved and present throughout the camp. They particularly valued the workshop session, which helped learners consolidate their experiences and connect what they learned at camp to their school curriculum. The Grade 5's expressed their gratitude with plenty of hugs for the coaches, reflecting their appreciation for the memorable camp experience.

CAMP #7 27-29 AUGUST RIVERLANDS AND CHATSWORTH PRIMARY SCHOOLS, MALMESBURY **GRADE 5 CAMP**

This camp began with rain but ended with sunshine! Even the initial rainy weather couldn't dampen the spirits or energy levels of our Grade 5 learners. Given the trauma of the recent flooding in their hometown (more about this below), camp provided a much-needed opportunity for the students to decompress and enjoy themselves.

The learners truly cherished the space to play and engage with one another. They enthusiastically embraced all the lessons from camp, discovering how to apply their newfound knowledge back in the classroom.





CAMP #8 3-5 SEPTEMBER WES-EIND PRIMARY SCHOOL, **FRANSCHHOEK GRADE 6 CAMP**

This camp was a fantastic experience for the returning Grade 5 learners from Wes-Eind, who truly came alive during the orientation session. Educators appreciated how the activities were closely tied to the core theme of social awareness and recognised the positive impact this would have on their classroom environment.



"Our children are so used to being exposed and being embarrassed... here at Bridges they could just be themselves I saw children take their usual masks off and they had the chance to just be a child... I just realised how many of our boys have a fatherless situation at home and here they call the coach Papa JP. Even to get to say that word on a daily basis is significant. Many of them don't get the chance to call somebody Papa... many of them are part of this fatherless generation... so I think it meant a lot to these boys."

"I must also commend your team because they teach the children about teamwork, but they also model teamwork and they do it so well and that's wonderful, it's such a good example."

"Seeing them (the learners) in this environment seeing them out of the normal classroom setup you realise how some children are labeled as naughty but here (at Bridges) they were just children, treated equally, no labels. The Bridges coaches can't believe it when I tell them which children are naughty at school. Here they act so different, we don't see that naughty side. And I realise that often they are only acting up because a lot of the time an adult has failed them."

-Flood Relief-

Riverlands and Chatsworth Primary School Community

Riverlands and Chatsworth Primary Schools, two of our partner schools were affected by flooding in August, when a nearby dam burst and resulted in severe flooding in these communities outside Malmesbury.

"When the water came down, you could see the trauma and children becoming hysterical and the chaos... as people evacuated their homes, screaming," says Gift of the Givers spokesperson Ali Sablay.

Several residents were treated for shock at the Riverland Clinic and many residents were looked after in community centres where they are receiving food, shelter, clothing and other aid.

Common Ground Church, one of our funding partners, gave money towards flood relief for learners from Riverlands and Chatsworth Primary Schools who had lost possessions during the flood. Our team bought and delivered school uniforms and shoes to these learners.

We were so glad to welcome both these partner schools on camp the following week, to help them decompress from the social-emotional effects of this trauma, in a safe and nurturing environment.
