Each term we spotlight some Bridges team members, this term we get to know Rene, Matthew & Geraldine.





Thank you to Geraldine and now Jakes, our star volunteer, for coordinating the purchasing and packing of these goody bags over the last few months.

The Knitting Fairies, a volunteer group of knitters, delivered 800 beautiful handmade beanies to Bridges this year, which were given to children over the cold winter months. A heartfelt thank you to all the Knitting Fairies.

We know how much these gifts mean to our learners, there is always great excitement and gratitude when these goodies are distributed.







### **Overview of Term 4 Camps**

### CAMP #1 JOOSTENBURG PRIMARY, GRADE 5, JOOSTENBERG VLAKTE

Joostenberg Primary is a farm school, on the Joostenberg Vlakte, just outside Durbanville. The learners from Joostenburg are from the under resourced surrounding community and as a Quintile 3, no fee school, they rely heavily on external care and support. Our Ed team visited the school, a week before camp, to help prepare learners to maximize their camp experience. The children enjoyed every part of the camp programme and participated with enthusiasm and minimal behavioural issues. The Ed team was impressed with the way the Educators from this school engaged with and spoke to their learners, with dignity and compassion.

#### CAMP #2 BERGENDAL PRIMARY, GR 5, PAARL

Bergendal Primary is a quintile 1, no fee farm school from the South of Paarl. The learners were well mannered and worked well as a team. The activity outcomes were achieved and the teachers supported the programme with energy and enthusiasm too.

### CAMP #3 TREVOUR MANUAL PRIMARY, GR 5 (GROUP 1), FISANTEKRAAL

Trevour Manual is a no fee school from Fisantekraal. Because of the large size of the grade, our team split the group into two separate camps, run over 2 consecutive weeks. The first camp was one of the best Grade 5 groups that our team has experienced. Given the harsh realities of the learner's social surroundings, the children were fully engaged in all the activities and quickly displayed trust towards their coaches in their respective groups.

### CAMP #4 TREVOUR MANUAL PRIMARY, GR 5 (GROUP 2), FISANTEKRAAL

This Grade 5 camp also included x10 Grade 6 prefects for 2023, that were included to trial the prefect camp to be held at Bridges with prefects from all our partner schools in Jan 2023. The prefect trial component proved to be a valuable learning curve as the learners displayed leadership qualities but lacked practical leadership skills. The Bridges Team were able to guide those learners through the

LEAD model while sticking to the planned cognitive and motor skill activities. The educators observed how the learners adapted from their normal school behaviour towards servant leadership behaviour over the camp period.

The creative arts part of the programme proved to be the champion activity for the Grade 5 learners where self-expression through their creative art works was so beautifully displayed. Two boys were so inspired by the Bridges environment and space, that they performed a spontaneous, unrehearsed/ freestyle rap song around the campfire, all about their experience at Bridges. The learners were a rewarding group to work with, as they provided our Facilitators with a challenge in terms of coaching and the reward of seeing their young lives grow socially and emotionally over the experience.

We also include at the end of this Newsletter, some beautiful letters of appreciation and thanks, received from our partner schools this term. Enjoy reading their feedback on the impact the Bridges outdoor education programme has had on their learners, schools and communities.

#### Story about a post camp, school visit

Last Friday, we went to visit grade 5 learners from a primary school that had their camp with us in May of this year. I was excited to see them and keen to know if, and how, two and a half days of camp had influenced their lives post-camp.

When we arrived in the courtyard, the learners formed a guard of honour for us to walk through while singing a song of thanks, and greeting us with smiles and much excitement. At the end of the line, one of the groups performed their camp-created war cry. To say we were deeply touched by this gesture would be an understatement.

I was assigned to go to each class and informally ascertain their current progress, as well as to leave them with some motivation and a reminder that we still believe in their greatness and potential.


Three of the four classes indicated that they had applied teamwork, courage, respect, and trust both in class and at home. Many had also begun to practice "focusing skills," which is an important part of listening comprehension. Their progress, which included grade increases, was all confirmed by the class teachers who were present while I spoke with them.

However, three things stood out for me.

The fourth class admitted that they did not put the values and skills they learned at camp to use. Their brutal honesty and respectful manner in which they shared this astounded me. I thanked them for their candor and continued to motivate them. Internally, however, I was perplexed by their respectful truthfulness. The only answer I could come up with was that they still had that level of respect for me as a coach, and that even though they hadn't applied it yet, they had just done so.

Secondly, many learners told me about how they applied themselves at home. "Coach, I never listened to my mother. I always refused when she asked me to do something at home. I also had a negative attitude towards her. I've changed my attitude since returning from camp." So I asked her if there was something specific that happened at camp that made her decide to change the behaviour. "Well, coach, everyone at camp spoke to me with kindness and respect. You, the other coaches, and even the teachers who were there. So it made me think about how I speak to my mother and that I should change my attitude. So I did."

Finally, as I walked out of one of the classrooms, a girl handed me a note (see below). Keep in mind that their camp was 5 months ago. So, according to my theory, a single moment of positive connection and affirmation can have a long-term impact on a child's life. They will never forget how you made them feel.

Many of our learners have never been beyond the borders of Mitchell's Plain and the mere drive in a luxury bus was an experience to behold and capture. Added to this experience were the warm showers learners could take after activities before they settled down to have a hearty - delicious meal.

Learner engagement offered each learner the opportunity to socialize across the four different classes and getting to know each other in a fun social context; where barriers of shame, being shy and being awkward were dismantled. Opportunities for trust and acceptance were also created.

After camp affects - these were the changes teachers noticed and celebrate these improvements daily.

- 1. Improved Discipline in certain instances
- 2. Teamwork Team spirit
- 3. Ownership picking up trash and cleaning up in class.
- 4. Better relationship with teachers and peers
- 5. Understanding accountability and taking responsibility.

Teachers reported that the above has become more evident in some learners' actions and changed behaviour was definitely evident in most.

Learner teacher engagement has also shifted from a place of reprimand to a place of understanding and fostering an environment of hope.

The camp was a unifying tool for the grade and also allowed for better collaboration between learner and teacher.

The camp has allowed for the alignment of school values with the learner experience

In conclusion, the tranquility and serenity of the camp surroundings is an escape from the socially despaired environment experienced by our learners daily. Being in nature detached our learners from the socio-economic factors which plague their lives.

Thank you Bridges for your kind and open hearts in striving to make a difference in the lives of those most marginalized.
