Term 2 Camps Overview: Expanding Horizons and Deepening Impact

Term 2 saw us hosting 13 fully funded outdoor education camps, reaching 1103 learners and 51 educators, from 9 partner schools.

From Strand to Malmesbury, from Gugulethu to Durbanville, children from underresourced communities were immersed in experiences that sparked imagination, built confidence, and cultivated leadership.

Across all camps, learners engaged in hands-on, values-based activities that brought our core themes - teamwork, trust, respect, courage, and social awareness - to life. Whether building rafts, navigating the "A-frame," or tackling challenges like "Leaky Pipes" and "Toxic Waste," children collaborated, communicated, and discovered their own potential.

At several camps, educators reported noticeable shifts in learner behaviour: typically shy or disengaged students stepped up to lead; those struggling academically showed new confidence; and emerging leaders were identified for prefect roles back at school.




"The shy learners came forward and were involved in the camp activities.

Meaningful relationships formed between learners from different schools and backgrounds at our combined camps-bridging language and demographic divideshighlighting the importance of inclusion and shared experience.


Educators were not only participants but partners-eager to implement what they had learned back in their classrooms, particularly the cognitive and social-emotional skills embedded in our workshops.

A highlight for many was receiving toiletry packs and warm, hand-knitted beanies, small acts of care that made a lasting impression.

Here is some feedback from the learners who visited Bridges this term- this was what they said they learned, loved and will always remember about camp;


"I learned that to be patient will help you. And teamwork." "I learned that social awareness is being aware of others emotions and feelings."

"I will remember staying here, the food and the games I played with others." "I will always remember how well and nice the coaches treated me."		




Data Dashboard is Live



Q10. What is one important value you learned or practiced at camp that you can take back to school




Q11. Did you try something new or exciting at camp







Shift from Pre to Post




Q8. When you face a challenge now, how do you motivate yourself

How has the camp changed how you think you can work in groups at school going forward $% \left(1\right) =\left\{ 1\right\} =\left\{ 1$






Thank You To our Donors
