### **Term 3 Camps Overview:**

This past term at Bridges was filled with life-giving moments, laughter, and significant growth. Over the course of **15 camps** with **11 partner schools**, we hosted 1015 learners and 50 educators, supported by **134 incredible volunteers**. Together, learners and educators shared in over **7 455 meals**, experienced the beauty of nature, and took part in meaningful activities that stretched their bodies, minds, and hearts.





# Growth in Confidence and Self-Belief

For many learners, camp provided the chance to discover their own potential. Educators saw children overcoming self-doubt and stepping into leadership roles.

# **Growth in Social and Emotional Development**

Learners also made strides in empathy, discipline, and emotional growth. Educators observed learners showing greater respect, kindness, and relational maturity.

"I was so inspired when one of my learners spoke to me about self-awareness, we had a conversation about their strengths and weaknesses, so from there I've noticed that even their thinking and reasoning capacity has improved."

We are deeply grateful for this meaningful partnership and excited about the impact it will have in shaping young lives.








## **100 Bishops Volunteers**
